



Community Speedwatch in Standlake - Update

We now have a 'GO LIVE' date of the 26th November and our Speedwatch Co-ordinator Robert Maxwell is working hard to ensure all the appropriate training is completed and processes in place so the group is ready to start operating. At one of the recent training sessions a number of residents did comment and offer words of encouragement to the members in their high-viz jackets; your support is appreciated!



The group has 17 volunteers so far and two further training sessions have been arranged for Friday 12th November and Saturday 20th November, both commencing at 10am in the Village Car Park next to the Church. In addition to becoming familiar with the equipment (SID and radar gun), these sessions will be as though live speed checks are being done and how to record the required information of the offending vehicle which needs to include make, model, registration, colour, speed, time of offence to see if there are any difficulties and work on solutions.

More volunteers are still required! The more teams that can be mobilised around the village the better and the Parish Council will fund additional speed detection equipment.
